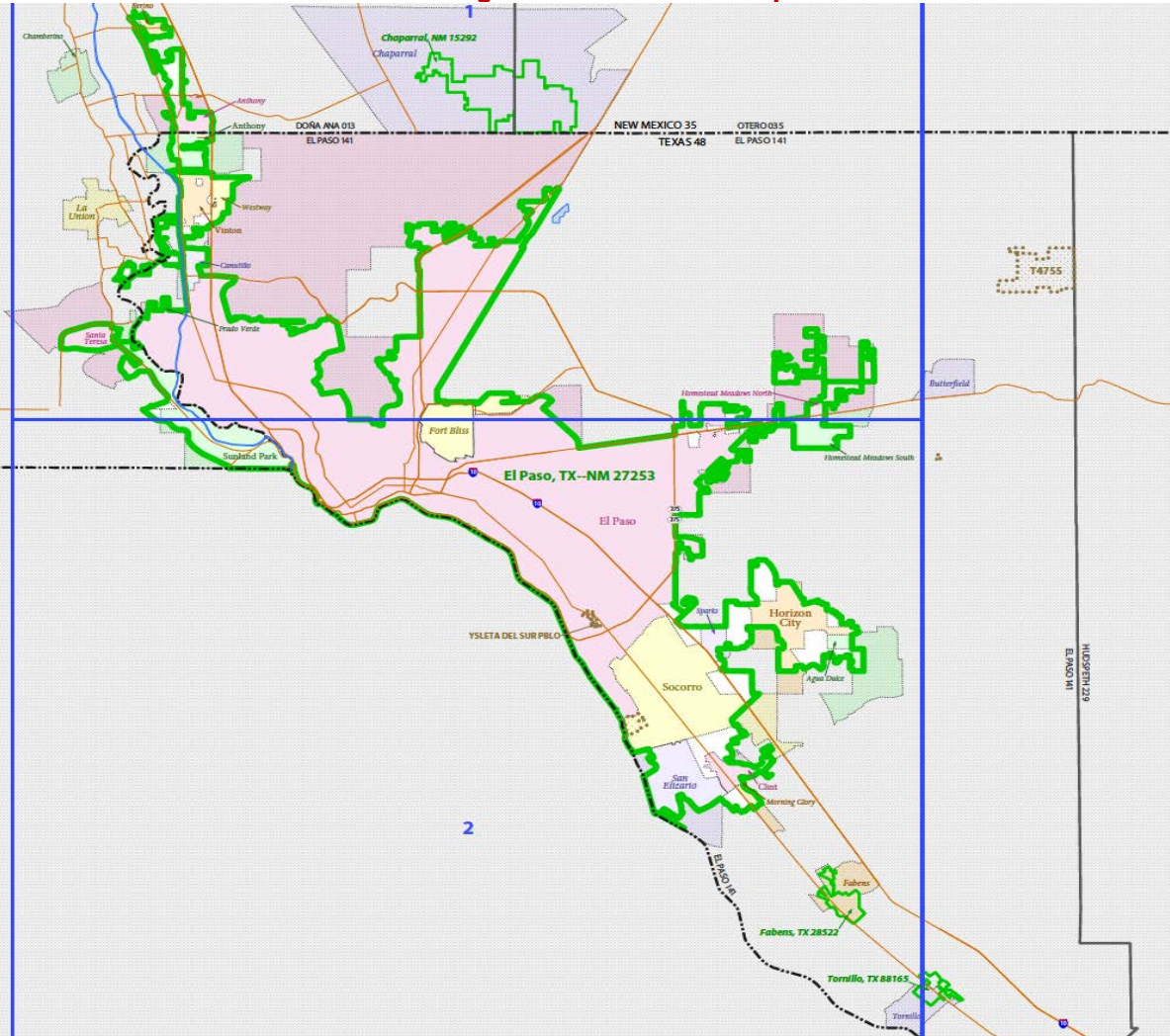

Where international, state, county, and/or MCD boundaries coincide, the map shows the boundary symbol for each (the highest ranking of these boundaries).

1. A "1" following an MCD name denotes a MCD. A "2" following a place name indicates that a place MCD coincides with the state name and ZIP code on the place. For this MCD label is not shown.

2. MCD boundaries are shown in the following states in which some or all MCDs function as general purpose governmental units: Connecticut, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Wisconsin, Montana, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Dakota, Vermont, and West Virginia. Other than Illinois and Nebraska, some counties contain unincorporated places and therefore their state names cannot be used to identify unincorporated localities.
