AMISTAD CARES UTILITY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM DEADLINE

Amistad continues taking applications for the AmistadCARES Utility Assistance Program. The program can provide up to 12 months of assistance to cover past-due water, gas, and electric bills.

Who qualifies?

Households with incomes no more than 80% of area median income (AMI)* meeting the following conditions:

- One or more individuals in the household has:
 - Qualified for unemployment benefits OR
 - o Has experienced a reduction in household income,
 - Incurred significant costs,
 - Experienced other financial hardship due directly or indirectly to the COVID-19 pandemic, AND
 - Has received a past due utility notice

Requirements:

- o Must reside within the City of El Paso limits
- o Have an active and verifiable account with the utility company
- o Must reside within the property for which the assistance is being requested
- Must NOT be receiving utility assistance from other sources


"Grand Candela" Memorial at Walmart - Cielo Vista honoring the lives lost on August 3, 2019

AMISTAD BEHIND-THE-SCENES



The role of a Guardianship Case Manager (GCM) can be very rewarding as they build strong, trusting relationships with our clients and ensure their medical, physical and social needs are being addressed and met. Our GCMs are on call 24/7 and are available when our clients need them, most who are elderly.

Inevitably, every year we have clients who lose the battle to illnesses. Sadly, in 2020, 52 clients passed away, 11 being COVID-19 related. As the guardian of our clients, the GCMs arrange funeral services. San Jose Funeral Homes has been a partner to Amistad and has assisted with the funeral arrangements for our clients.

The Guardianship Department took a tour of San Jose Funeral Homes, to learn more about the work that goes into the funeral process. The tour helped the GCMs learn and become familiar with the behind-the-scenes of a funeral home.

CHALLENGES

- Fear of COVID adjustment to PPE/face masks, social distancing, staff testing positive
- Labor market/reduced workforce/hiring challenges
- Families First Coronavirus Response Act compliance
- Spontaneous visits by Compliance Officers
- Managed Transportation Organization Program transition losing revenue
- Decreased ridership during the pandemic
- Increased costs due to pandemic
- · Additional responsibilities for staff under new programs while maintaining existing programs
- Restrictions at state facilities limited the work of Guardianship Case Managers and TCDD Peer Support Specialists (PSS) in mentoring their assigned mentees
- TCDD PSS trainings transitioned to virtual, some PSS did not have the appropriate technology to participate
- Locating suitable housing, lack of mental health programs, landlords not willing to work with population related to the homeless
- System-centered approach to homelessness as opposed to a client-centered approach
- Unable to conduct/attend outreach events
- Working with subcontractors
- Annual audits
- HVAC System repair
- Roof/wall/facility repairs
- Storage limitations for clients' items and files
