

ADVOCATING FOR OUR CLIENTS

Ms. E is a Veteran who had returned to school after her service and was struggling to pay her mortgage and utility payments. She contacted our Veterans Department for assistance and stated she was having difficulty obtaining the necessary documents to complete her application. She was only missing one document for her to receive assistance. Seeing her distress, our Veterans Navigator contacted the bank himself. After being transferred several times, he was able to speak with someone who could help. He communicated the situation of Ms. E and advocated on her behalf. In doing so, he was able to obtain the missing document for her application and processed the payment for her outstanding mortgage and utilities.

BRINGING FAMILIES TOGETHER

Maintaining holiday cheer for our clients can be difficult when experiencing less than ideal circumstances. At Amistad, we provide families with a safe space to visit their children, empowering parents to be the best mother or father they can be. On Christmas day, our Resource Coaches witnessed several families making the most of their supervised visitation sessions. One father in particular brought several gifts to visit with his 8-year-old daughter. He brought her a doll with a sunflower dress because he knew that was her favorite flower. His daughter beamed with excitement and proceeded to open the gifts with her father. They assembled a dollhouse and pretended to drink tea in their pretend kitchen. Once the visit had ended, the father approached our Resource Coach with tears in his eyes and thanked her for her services. He stated that this was a very special day for him, and he was grateful for the opportunity to spend Christmas with his daughter.

CHIMES

Consumer Health Insurance Marketplace Enrollment Services

The Affordable Care Act was developed to help individuals access affordable health through health insurance а insurance marketplace where families and individuals purchase federally regulated can and subsidized health insurance during open enrollment. However. finding the right plan can be confusing. Our CHIMES Team navigates clients through the eligibility and enrollment process by answering their questions and hosting several enrollment events.

Guardianship

The Guardianship Program provides caring and compassionate Guardianship services to persons who have been declared by the probate court system to be incapable of caring for their own health and welfare. Amistad Guardians are responsible for ensuring the clients' physical, social, medical, mental health, legal, funeral, and financial needs are met.

Money Management

Amistad's Money Management Program provides an array of social services to elderly and adult persons with disabilities who live within the city limits of El Paso. A Case Manager is assigned to assist the individual with creating a budget, ensuring that their basic needs are being met, paying their bills on time and that the individual is residing in a safe environment.



PROMOTING QUALITY OF LIFE

Client Success Story

Within the Amistad Guardianship Program, Guardians are responsible for the wellbeing of their clients. This includes any major medical decisions, like a major surgery. Mr. A has been a guardianship client for over 20 years who loves Raisin Bran cereal and Raisinets. When he was referred to Amistad, his mental health was unstable as he was paranoid, and he refused to walk as he believed he was paralyzed. He would constantly refuse assistance from Amistad and other agencies as he believed he could manage on his own. However, our Guardians persisted and

advocated for him throughout the years to improve his quality of life. In working with foster care providers and a structured setting, his overall health improved, and he started walking again. He began to attend adult day care for social stimulation and has since thrived. During this time, he made a female friend who he considers her to be his girlfriend and enjoys talking to her over the telephone.





For years his cardiologist had been recommending a pacemaker replacement and watchman device to ensure his heart was functioning at a stable rhythm. Mr. A refused the surgery multiple times as he believed he could cure himself. About a month ago, our client finally agreed to have the surgery and it was a success. It took a team of all past and present Guardianship Case Managers to work with our client addressing his needs and never giving up on the passion to serve and improve his quality of life. His Guardian has mentioned her favorite qualities Mr. A displays is his attentiveness. jokes. sweetness, and compassion.

EL CAMINO A CASA



STREET OUTREACH: SUCCESS STORY

Mr. R had been homeless and living in an abandoned truck for over a year. He initially heard from a friend that Amistad was assisting the homeless population and walked into our lobby to ask for assistance. Mr. R had a difficult time trusting new people and was skeptical of our intensive case managers. His patience was very low, and he seemed to get frustrated easily. This did not deter our team.

Mr. R's Intensive Case Manager provided consistent customer service and created a safe space for him to communicate his needs. After several meetings, he provided the appropriate documents to initiate the housing process. As of November of 2023, Mr. R is housed in his own apartment, sleeping in a bed to call his own. He stops by often to thank our team and drop off small gifts to his case manager.




